Why Should I Care?

Domestic violence is prevalent in every community, and affects all people regardless of age, socio-economic status, sexual orientation, gender, race, religion, or nationality. The devastating consequences of domestic violence can cross generations and last a lifetime.

The most dangerous time for a victim of domestic violence is when he/she is in the process of leaving.

WINGS provides a safe escape route.

THE FACTS

What is Domestic Violence?

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior used to gain power and control over an intimate partner. Abuse can be physical, sexual, emotional, financial or psychological and can include behaviors that frighten, intimidate, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, blame, injure, or wound someone.

1 in 3 women in the United States has experienced some form of physical violence by a partner.

Over **25,000** Orders of Protection were issued in **Cook County** in 2015.

The Chicago Police Department receives an average of 500 domestic violence calls each day. Over **182,000 calls a year.**

How Bad Is It?

99% of all cases of domestic violence include financial abuse. Victims are prevented from acquiring, using or maintaining financial resources.

Every **9 seconds** in the US a woman is assaulted or beaten.

Victims of domestic violence lose a total of **8 million days** of paid work each year.

The cost of intimate partner violence in the US alone exceeds **\$5.8 billion** per year.

Teens that have witnessed violence within their own family are 50% more likely to be involved in an abusive relationship themselves.

What is WINGS?

WINGS cares for victims when they are most vulnerable to harm. Clients are embraced and assisted every step of the way, no matter how long it takes.

Emergency Safe Houses

On any given night, WINGS Safe Houses provide a short-term safe haven for those fleeing violent situations. Our Safe Houses have the capacity to provide more than 31,000 nights of shelter every year.

Transitional and Permanent Housing

WINGS transitional and permanent housing programs help victims and their children continue to move forward with rebuilding their lives after escaping a violent situation. The Housing Programs provide assistance with rental costs along with counseling, employment assistance and children services.

WINGS Permanent Housing provides a long-term option for individuals with disabilities.

Resale

WINGS residents receive gift cards to purchase needed items from our three WINGS resale stores.

HOW WE DO IT

Community-Based Services

WINGS also offers services to survivors of domestic violence who are not yet ready for, or in need of, housing.

Counseling

Counselors offer safety planning and guidance to individuals who are coping with the trauma of domestic violence. This holistic approach highlights, encourages, and empowers each individual to make positive changes in their lives.

Medical Collaborative

WINGS partners with other domestic violence agencies on a regional medical response collaborative that educates and trains medical personnel at hospitals to identify signs of domestic violence and provides onsite counseling to patients.

ALAS

ALAS (Advocating for Latinas Achieving Self-Sufficiency) is a culturally specific program that addresses the unique needs of the Latina domestic violence population by emphasizing self-development and self-sufficiency.

Project Lifeline

Survivors of domestic violence and community members serve as mentors to those who are currently maneuvering their newfound independence.

MARTINA'S STORY OF SURVIVAL



Martina came to the Safe House after the situation with her husband became too much to bear. She had moved to the United States to be with the father of her baby but once here, he began to abuse her emotionally and physically. She had no friends and no family in the country so she sought help from the Domestic Violence Hotline. They referred her to WINGS and she came with her three children and a diaper bag in May 2016.

The staff at WINGS helped her file a restraining order against her husband, establish her immigration status, and assisted her with finding child care and other resources. She eventually moved into WINGS apartments and started working full time.

She moved out of her WINGS apartment in May 2017, and now has her own car, is working two jobs and is happy and excited about the future. "I continue to work hard for my children," she said. "They get me through the days that are tougher than others."

She is also grateful to WINGS for the support and encouragement the staff provided.

"WINGS means everything to me. They gave me all the tools I needed to move forward," she said. "Every time I felt down, the staff encouraged me and gave me the courage to do it."

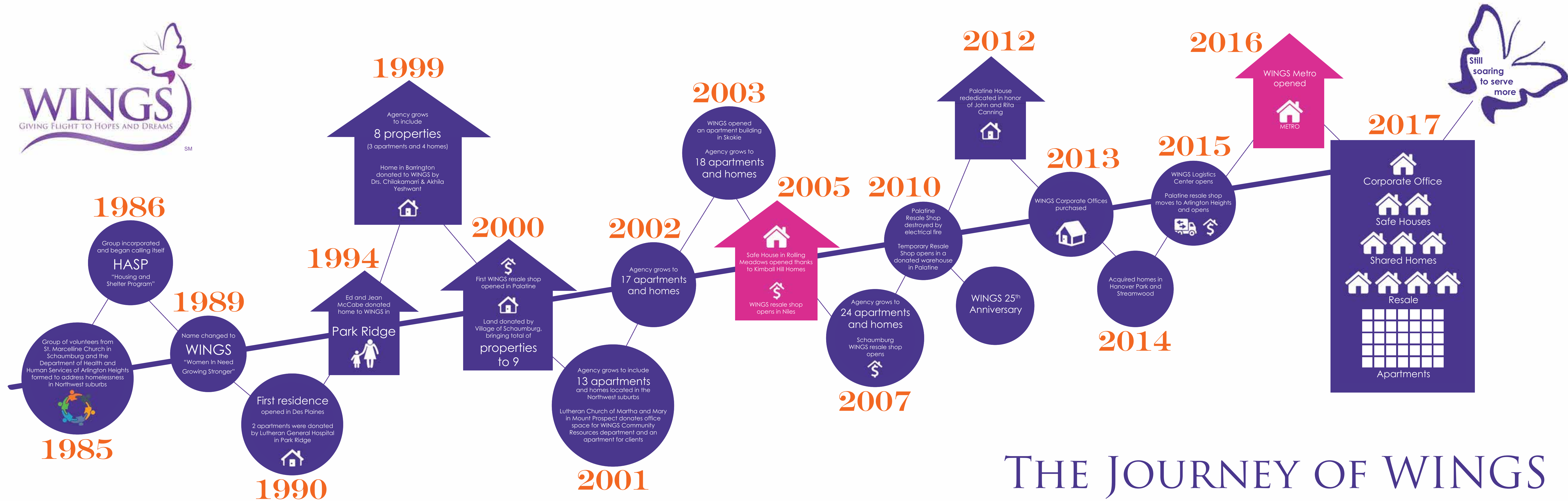

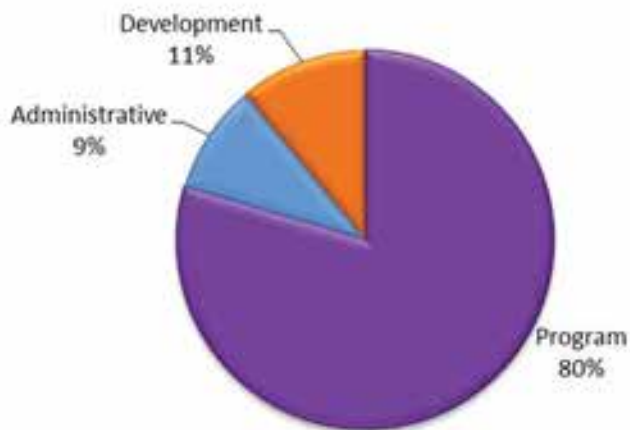
